\*OVERALL SURVEY ASSESSMENT: This survey attempts to document all properties within --1976 Lumpkin County that meet the criteria for National Register listing.

CONTENT ASSESSMENT:

SURVEY COVERAGE: This survey covers the accessible roads in the county. Private roads and those not easily traveled were not surveyed. Properties of various types/styles have been included. Most structures are simple and vernacular. Both individual and district properties have been included.

DESCRIPTIONS: Slides are sharply focused, well framed and correctly exposed. Each property is fully described by architectural style, construction date, facade material, and floor plan. Notes supplement the descriptions and slides.

STATEMENTS OF SIGNIFICANCE: Some statements of architectural and historical significance are given. Comments often supply information on historical significance.

MAPS: The Lumpkin County map is in fair condition and is easily cross-referenced to the survey forms and the locality map. Although each location is clearly marked, some are smeared or faded since they are marked in ink. The properties marked on the Dahlonega map are barely legible.

SUMMARY OF COUNTY DEVELOPMENT: There is a good summary of Lumpkin's county development which addresses the historical development and the architectural characteristics of the county.

A History of Lumpkin County by Andrew W. Cain, which covers the first hundred years from 1832-1932, provided the surveyor with general historical information. The discovery of gold in 1828 by Benjamen Parks on property now known as the Calhoun Mines is the most important factor in the history of the area, although few actual structures remain from these early days. The removal of the Cherokees, via the "Trail of Tears," and the parceling of their land into 40 acre gold lots and 160 acre farm lots is generally known information which was important to the physical development of the area. At the time that the county was created in 1832, following the discovery of gold, the town of Auraria was developed in response to the large influx of people. The community was first called Nuckells-ville after Nathaniel Nuckells, who built a hotel there in 1832, but since 1833 has been known as Auraria. It is reported that the town in its early years numbered several thousands but that after the decline in gold mining in the 1850's in the area it began losing population. Of the 18-20 stores, 4-5 taverns and 15 law offices reported to have originally been in the town, only a few structures, some of later nineteenth century date, remain. The county's oldest church, Antioch Baptist Church, is now in a rebuilt structure although its cemetery dates back to gold mining days.

Dahlonega became the county seat in 1833, and the present courthouse replaced the original log structure in 1836. A branch of the U. S. Mint was opened nearby in 1838.

Subsequently, the old mint, closed at the outbreak of the Civil War, was destroyed. On its foundations Price Memorial Building of North Georgia College was built in 1879. Buildings on the east side of the square have replaced an old hotel built by an early settler, Harrison Riley, but those on the west side constructed by a gold miner, Frank Hall, in the 1870's remain.

In addition to Cain's history of the county, articles on the development of the gold industry written by Dr. Fletcher Green detail the early history of this area. According to one informant, Frances Jones is now writing a new history of Lumpkin County. Several local contacts provided sites information to the surveyor: Mrs. Ida Philips, Vice President, Dahlonega-Lumpkin County Historical Society; Mrs. Madelaine Anthony, ex-curator of the Gold Museum that is now housed in the courthouse, who has collected much information on the county; Dr. Ray Rensi, of the Social Science Department of North Georgia College who has collected data about old families and county history; J. Marlin Smith, Superintendent of Schools; Lee Duval, Laurel Knob Gift Shop in Auraria, who came to the county about eight years ago from Florida and has collected old photographs and mining history information; Ralph Yates and Reese Scull, U. S. Forest Service, Chestattee Ranger District in Dahlonega.

Not as many original families in old homeplaces were found in this county as in Forsyth and Dawson Counties. The surveyor did not find as many early, plain-style and simple cabin type

of structures here. Traces of older structures, dilapidated houses and outbuildings, including log barns, were found. She also observed an unusual number of log structures, outbuildings as well as dwellings. It appears that either log buildings continued to be constructed late in the 19th century here, or that a number of the outbuildings belonged to houses that have since been replaced by newer buildings. There was evidence of more extensive recent building, including many brick homes, in this county than in the others also.

The United States Forest Service bought up approximately 57,000 acres in Lumpkin County beginning in the late 1930's.

Ms. Thurston conferred with forest rangers Ralph Yates and Reese Scull of the Chestatee Ranger District headquartered in Dahlonega, who reported that few extant structures remain in the forest. They provided names and locations for some of the buildings in the forest area, but access by automobile to much of the area was not possible.

At least two districts in this county would make eligible National Register Districts. In addition to the County Courthouse, which is already on the Register, several buildings around the square form a district area (Nos. 1-8). Hall's Block (No. 5) is a particularly nice example of a mid-century Italianate business block which is associated with the gold mining history of the county. Auraria, because of its representation of early gold mining history and extant early structures, is a second district (Nos. 51-56). This area, suggested as a pos-

sible heritage site in 1973, contains a hotel, c. 1833, a general store that is still in use, three houses (two early abandoned buildings and one of 1890), a c. 1910-20 bungalow occupied by the present owner of the store, and an old grave yard behind the rebuilt Antioch Baptist Church which contains graves of old Auraria gold miners and some Civil War markers in a finely detailed iron enclosure. There are several interesting church buildings which should be considered of potential architectural significance. St. Lukes Catholic Church (No. 14) is a nice example of a small frame, modified Victorian building with wooden tile patterns in multiple gables. Wesley Chapel Baptist Church (No. 109) is a frame building entered through an octagonal-shaped weather boarded-tower and has a cemetery with several nice Victorian monuments. Nimblewell Baptist Church (No. 106) is a small white frame structure with weather-boarding in a fan pattern in its triangular gable. Two structures associated with the gold mining history of the county are the Welch Home (No. 23) believed to date from c. 1836 and to be the oldest extant house in the county, and the Fry Home (No. 37), a Victorian, Queen Anne structure built by Colonel Fry who was the head of the Calhoun mines. The Smith House (No. 30), while not particularly outstanding as an architectural monument, nonetheless is typical of its turn-of-the-century date and has an interesting history as a well-known Dahlonega hotel. The Davis homeplace (No. 59), built c. 120 years ago, is a good example of a plain-style structure elaborated with Greek Revival

type detailing with extant outbuildings. The Old London Farm, with extant London store building that once served a stage route (No. 66); the Tate Farm (No. 91), with nicely detailed plantation plain-style house and outbuildings, one partially of log construction; and the Barnes Farm, with remains of a water wheel, are three ensembles of local significance. One outbuilding (No. 93) is also of architectural interest. It has an unusually complex plan and detailing of flush diagonal boarding on the facade. The large number of log structures merit further evaluation (Nos. 68, 69, 70, 85, 92, 96, 102, 103, 100 and 198). In addition, the Poore House (No. 64) is a house built to connect an extant log cabin, c. 1815, to a log kitchen which is reported to have connections to Indian history.


